improving math content knowledge of the teacher participants; increasing the use of technology by supplying training and equipment such as computer notebooks, flip camcorders, iPods, interactive whiteboards, and computer software; discussing and modeling effective instructional practices; creating project-based learning activities; participating in PLCs so teachers can apply and share best practices in mathematics; providing college / in-service credit; and keeping the participants informed on statewide teaching initiatives. Classroom visits, learning community discussions and teacher surveys will monitor the changes in instruction. Pre and post testing will monitor the

changes in teachers / students content knowledge.

### MAJOR ACCOMPLISHMENTS:

• The week long seminar on August 3-7 focused on the following topics: an in-depth study of various algebra and geometry content standards; strategies for using classroom technology for inquiry, collaboration and connection; real-world geometry lessons and the use of geometric software in the classroom; a review of the design process of project-based learning; and further TI-Navigator training provided by Bryson Perry.

- Fostering Geometric Thinking modules provided the after-school PLCs opportunities to develop new understandings of students' geometric thinking, broaden and express their own thinking through rich problems, and practice analyzing student work.
- The four day-long seminars included these activities: geometric investigations using numerous
  manipulatives and Geometer's Sketchpad software; opportunities for teachers to be engaged as
  collaborative learners in high-level mathematical tasks; discussion of PBL implementation strategies;
  and practice with the use of software applications and technology to engage students and enhance
  instruction.
- The second week long session held June 14-18, 2010 was a time to share the successes of the year and
  evaluate what had been done. Jerry Pomeroy provided one day of training on TechSteps management
  and core activities. Teachers presented the results of their PBLs, reviewed the Common Core
  Standards, and continued to investigate the use of technology tools in the classroom with instruction
  from Duane Lewis and Carrie Calloway.

### PROGRAM ACCOMPLISHMENTS:

 Met/collaborated with 25 elementary teachers (22 completed) in monthly professional learning communities within their individual counties

- Held roundtable discussions on the book *Letter to the New President* by Senator Robert C. Byrd. These discussions were centered on how to bring American History back into the classrooms and how to conduct debates in an elementary classroom.
- Participants attending the mini institutes were taught how to integrate technology with web-lessons into their classrooms.
- Participants watched a webinar on Traveling Trunks and began to create ideas for their own Traveling Trunks
- Participants explored the National Park Service Internet site and obtained information on the various American history topics and resources available to aid them in their classrooms.
- Participants explored various places where American History resources were available to support them and their students in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century.
- Participants attending the summer field experience went to the Boston, MA area where they visited the Plimoth Plantation and made contacts with the educational director. They attended professional development sessions at the USS Constitution Museum, The Old Statehouse Museum, and Lexington and Concord National Park where they also received curriculum materials. They walked the "Freedom Trail" and historical Salem with costumed guides. They attended a performance of the 1<sup>st</sup> Witch Trial in Salem and played the part of jurors. They reenacted The Boston Massacre trial. They toured the home of Paul Revere. Finally, they sailed the Boston Harbor as a historian explained the building of the city of Boston and discussed the value of the harbor to historical Boston.
- Participants attending the summer institutes at Ashland University in Ashland, Ohio received college credit and received training from expert historians/lecturers to deepen their content knowledge.
- · Participants were given instruction on teaching with Document Based Questions.

  entering high school in the Fall of 2011 to take Chemistry I or Conceptual Chemistry for high school
  graduation.
- Project REACT is designed to provide a pathway for teachers who are currently certified in middle school science or another discipline of science to obtain certification in Chemistry I in West Virginia.
- Currently, there are 20 teachers participating. The WVDE is partnering with RESA 2, RESA 3, and the teacher's county school system to provide this opportunity.
- The second component of Project REACT is a cohort of teachers who desire middle school science certification. Teachers will complete course work with the support of professional learning communities to complete the necessary requirements for certification in middle school science.

- Promoting high student engagement.

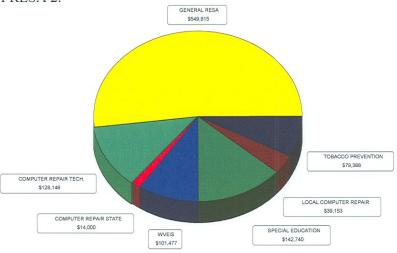

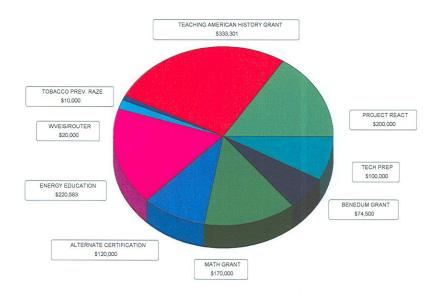
# RESA 2 PROGRAM ALLOCATIONS

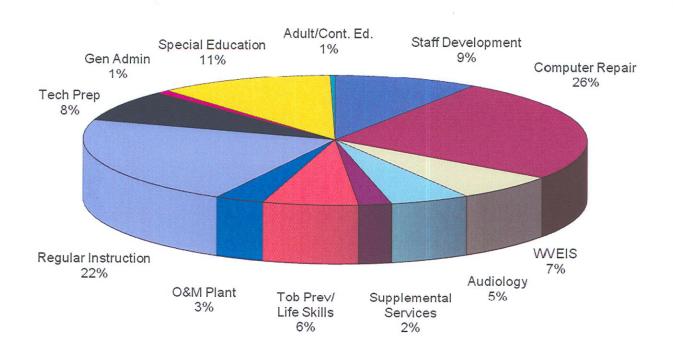
